Dr. Craig Dobbins joined the Purdue Agricultural Department in December of 1977 and has remained here ever since. He earned his Bachelor's of Science in Agricultural Business, his Master's of Science in Agricultural Economics from Iowa State, and Ph.D. from Oklahoma State University (1977). It was during this time, Dr. Dobbins would meet a lovely woman named Nancella who became his wife. They now have two children, Jarrett and Carrie. Jarrett and his family reside in California where he is a computer engineer for Apple. Carrie and her family are located in Indianapolis where she is a nurse practitioner.

While at Purdue, Dr. Dobbins has focused his efforts on farm management with an emphasis on applying computer information systems to farming decisions related to crop economics, farm financial

decisions, and farmland economics. Over the years, he has taught more than seven different courses, including: AGEC 410 farm management; AGEC 352 Quantitative methods for Firm Decision Making; AGEC 42500 – Estate Planning and Property Transfer; and AGEC 45600 – Federal Income Tax Law. In addition to teaching, Dobbins also took time to advise the Farm Management Club, supervise honor program theses, coordinate the computer decision making Top Farmer workshop, and conduct and publish the findings of the Purdue Farmland Survey, in addition to other activities.

Dr. Dobbins has received several top accolades during his time at Purdue University.
