- 2) a majority of the food (by value) is sold directly to "qualified end-users."

Modified requirements for a farm that is eligible for a qualified exemption in accordance with 21 CFR 112.5:

- a. The farm must establish and keep adequate records necessary to demonstrate that the farm satisfies the criteria for a qualified exemption, including a written record reflecting that an annual review has been performed and verification of the farm's continued eligibility for the qualified exemption.
- b. Modified labeling: The labeling requirement consists of including the name and complete business address of the farm where the produce was grown either on the label of the produce or to display the same information at the point-of-purchase.

A qualified exemption can be withdrawn in the event of an active investigation of a foodborne illness outbreak that is directly linked to a farm. The exemption may also be withdrawn if IDOH determines that inspection is necessary to protect the public health, and prevent or mitigate a foodborne illness outbreak based on conduct or conditions associated with the farm that are material to the safety of the food.
